2. Description of the Idea

The project aims to revitalize local communities using Osaka's public bath culture.

Sento (Ofuro Ya in the Kansai region) is a part of Japanese culture that has significantly contributed to public health. They are usually located in central areas of cities, and they have played an important role as a community hub.

Sento, which has existed as a part of the local infrastructure, has become no more than a form of recreation due to changes in lifestyle. It is now in decline, and it is said that one public bathhouse goes out of business every week.



(There were 2500 public bathhouses in Osaka 20 years ago, but today the number is fewer than 400)

By properly redefining the cultural role *Sento* has played to this day, we would like to preserve it as a place of acceptance. We would like to contemplate urban planning with an emphasis on *Sento* as a community hub.

By carrying out this project in cooperation with private companies, government, universities, communities, public bathhouses, and infrastructure companies, we would like to redefine the value of *Sento* and revitalize communities based on cooperation and reciprocity, similar to the communities during the Showa period.

Definition of a local community



We think that a local community is formed within the "family," at "work/school," and in the "local community." However, the local community, which should have intrinsically existed as a place of acceptance for such community refugees as single people, who have no family and single mothers who do not attend school or work, has collapsed. There are various reasons for the collapse of local communities, such as the growing increase in the population of singles, the low birthrate, an aging society, depopulation, urbanization, and the difficulty of socializing, but in any case, it is said that it has been some time since relationships with others have disappeared.

Issues such as single-living elderly, *kodokushi*, living assistance for single mothers, and day care waiting lists, which once used to be resolved by local communities, have emerged. On the other hand, *Sento*, which once used to be a central part of local communities, is now at its deathbed due to factors such as the aging society, lack of successors, and changes in local infrastructure. However, *Sento* has an element of unclothed social gathering where people can socialize regardless of age, gender, or status.

Various communities are facing various issues. There are communities with a lot of households, communities with a lot of single people, communities with a large elderly population, communities that require a lot of public assistance, and if there is a community centered around *Sento*, these issues will either be resolved or alleviated.

Reduction of nursing-care expenses

In Osaka, future nursing-care expenses will exceed ¥10,000 per household, and if people visit *Sento* rather than spending this money on adult daycare services, they can receive similar service and reduce nursing care expenses.

Serving as a daycare center

Parents can temporarily leave their children at Sento.

The child will be bathed, while the mom is working, and once she is done, she can take the child home and put the child to bed.

Managing health of the elderly

The dressing rooms can be opened to instructors to conduct exercises, which can be a health benefit to the elderly. Furthermore, it can serve as a place for socializing.

A place where men and women can socialize

Places like *Utagaki Furo* (searching for a marriage partner while reciting *tanka*) are increasing in number to appeal to the single population. Similarly, late marriages can be curbed by using a visit to *Sento* as an opportunity to search for a marriage partner.

(3) How to implement the idea.

Describe the process and milestones, etc.

Step 1: Identifying regional issues and regional resources

Holding a mapping party to identify the local resources (schools, restaurants, cinema theatres, daycare centers, stations, etc.). Confirming that the owners of Japanese public bathhouses are aware as to what kind of city they live in.

Step 2: Management of IT systems

Maintenance of media and database. Creating a shared database in a format that is easy to maintain and setting it as open data.

Step 3: Development of original novelties and goods

We will produce original novelties, food items and beverages, and we will offer an experience and things that can be obtained only that day and in that place.

Step 4: Strengthening regional cooperation system

We will aim to strengthen the cooperation among *Sento* facilities, with the municipal administration, universities, and local communities, and foster local communities of the city.

Step 5: Holding events

Funds will be raised via crowdfunding, and PR events will be held. Knowledge of each *Sento* will be shared and applied to the rest of the facilities.

Step 6: Involvement of infrastructure companies

Each railroad company, gas company, and electric company will be involved, and the connection and means of transportation among *Sento* facilities will be newly created. Conditions for easy travel among *Sento* facilities will be created.

In addition to the existing means of transportation, vehicles such as rental bicycles and rickshaws will be available.
